Many of you are aware that WV is a District, not a City (whereas NV has both a city and a district), and I often explain there's a legal difference, so it's not just a case of semantics. The LGA definitions are below. To my surprise, I've just found out that 'town' is a legal category as well -- didn't know that. Some background.

Before WV's centenary, G suggested to Ccl that we apply to be a city. At that time WV qualified (based on the estimated popn). They didn't. The census came out a few years later and then, b/c our popn had decreased, WV no longer qualified. The sign on the municipal hall has "DISTRICT".

☆ MUNICIPALITIES

Classification of municipalities

- **10** (1) A municipality must be incorporated as follows:
 - (a) as a village, if the population is not greater than 2 500;
 - (b) as a town, if the population is greater than 2 500 but not greater than 5 000;
 - (c) as a city, if the population is greater than 5 000;
 - (d) despite paragraphs (a) to (c), as a district municipality, if the area to be incorporated is greater than 800 nectares and has an average population density of less than 5 persons per hectare.
- (2) For the purpose of calculating the average population density, land continually covered by water must not be taken into account.
 - (3) Despite subsection (1), if the Lieutenant Governor in Council considers it to be in the public interest to do so, a municipality may be incorporated in another classification provided for in this Act.

Lunar eclipse 2019: A 'Super Blood Wolf Moon' is coming this weekend (1/20/19)

What is a super blood wolf moon?

A super blood wolf moon is a combination of three astronomical events -- all happening Sunday night.

A wolf moon is the first full moon of the year, named for wolf packs heard outside Native American villages this time of year, according to The Farmers' Almanac.

A <u>supermoon</u> is a full moon that happens when the moon also is at the closest point in its orbit to Earth, making the moon appear slightly larger. There will be two more supermoons this year -- Feb. 19 and March 21 -- but the January supermoon will be the closest and appear the biggest.

A blood moon is another name for a lunar eclipse, which makes the moon appear red.
